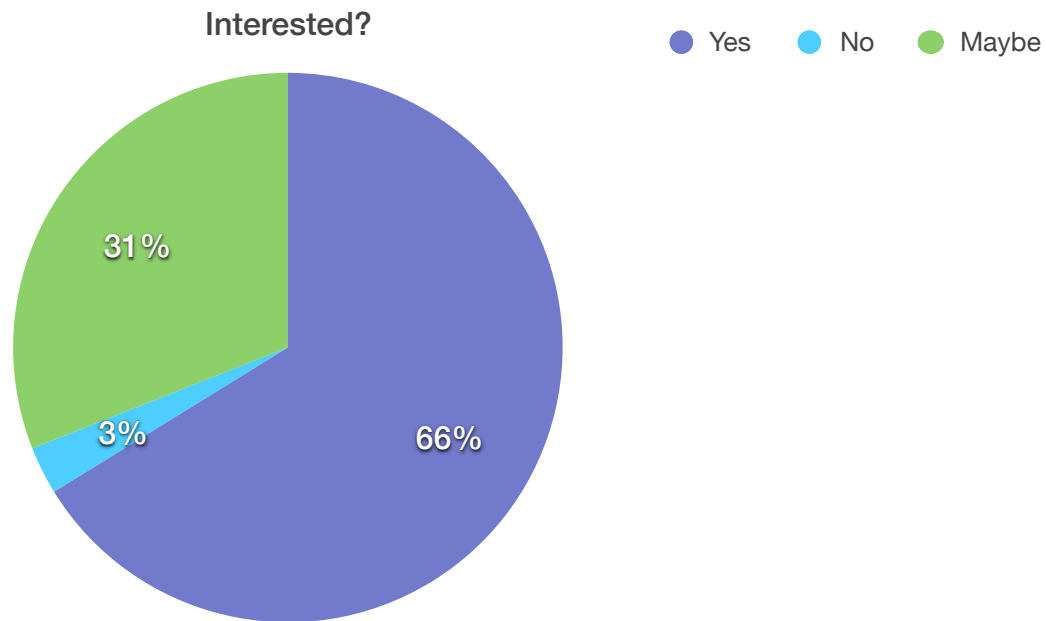


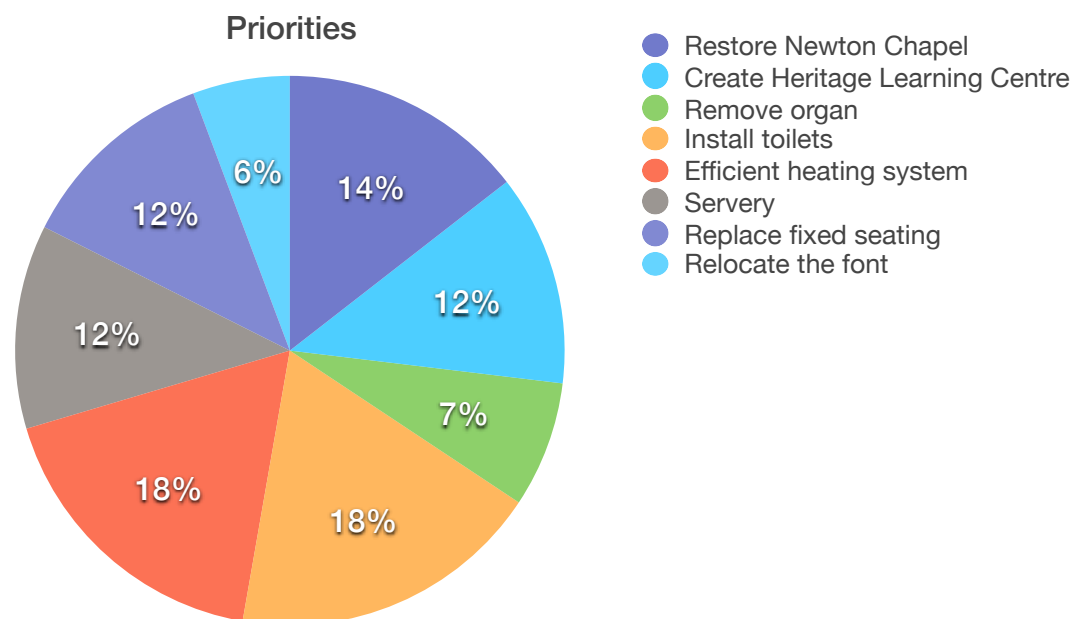

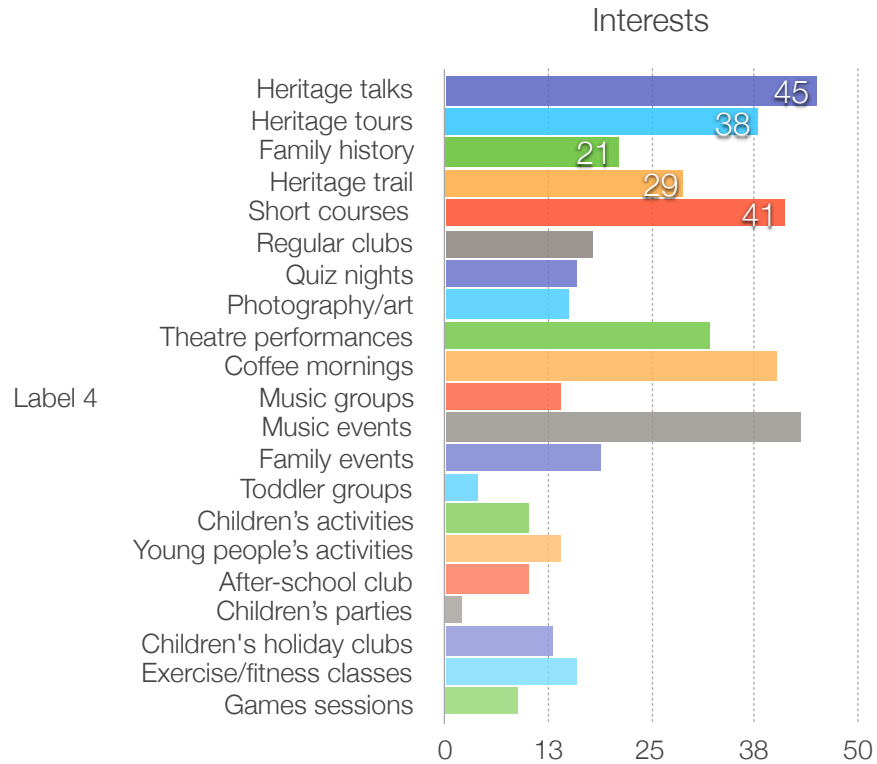

None of the above. Surely they should be in the village hall or Woolsthorpe Manor

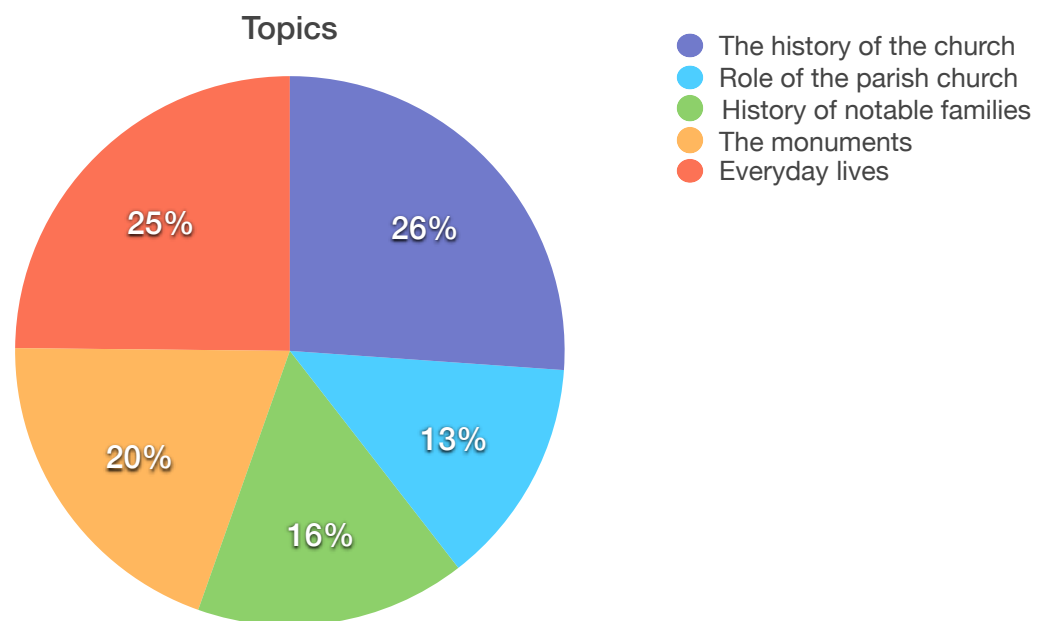
Different church services

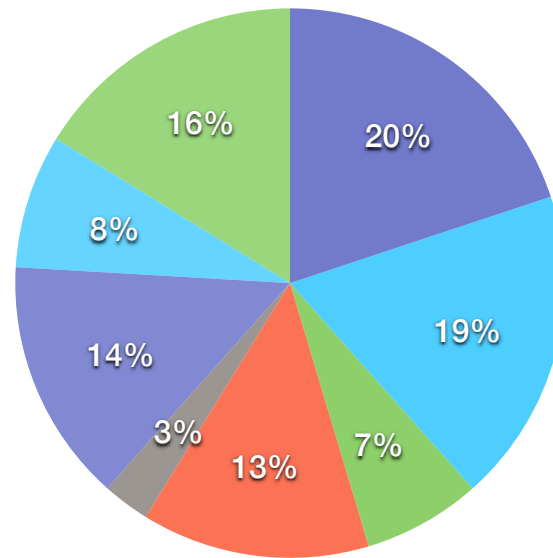

Toilets to be located outside church as no appropriate place inside

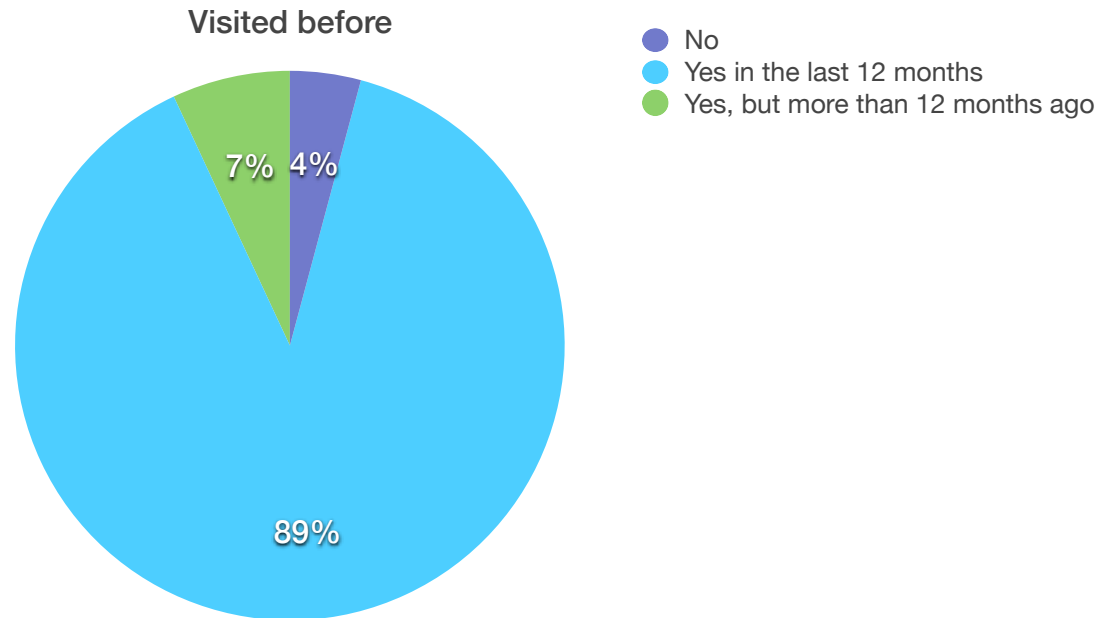
I'm impressed by your driver to encourage use of the church in the 21st Century

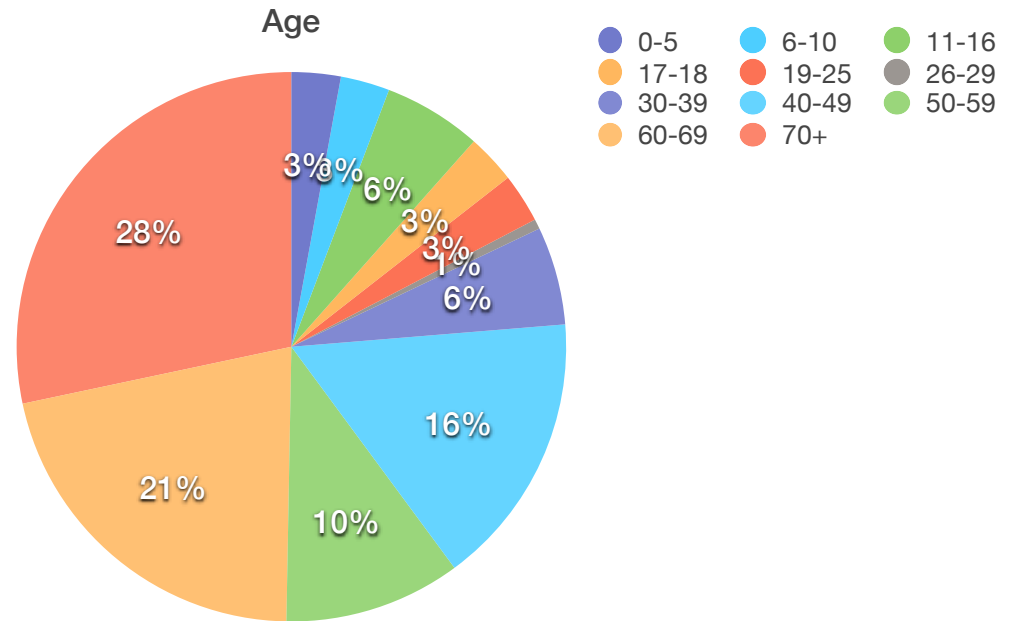

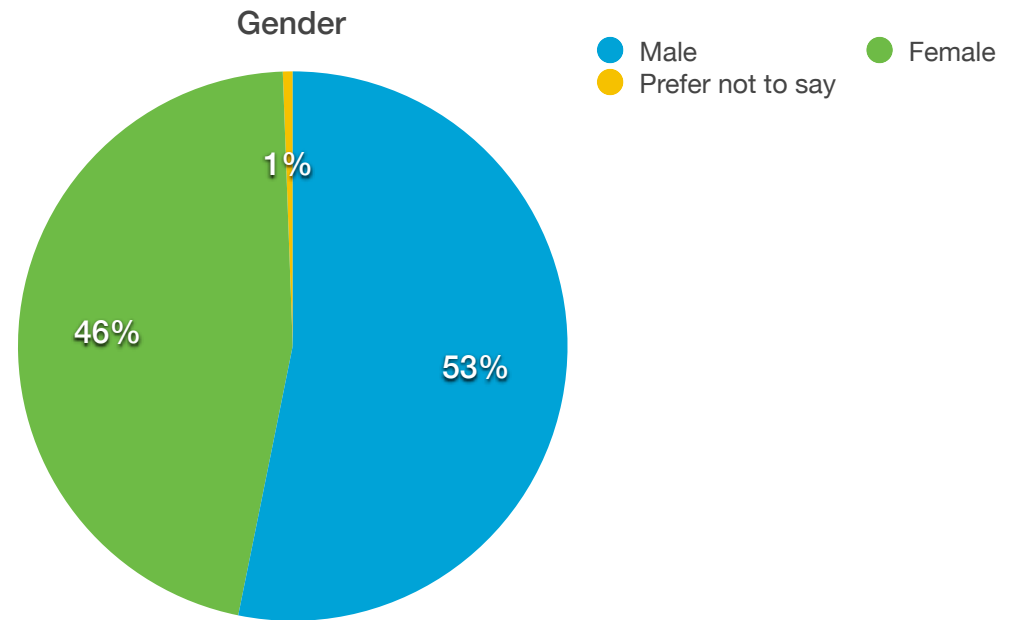

How many in your household identify as

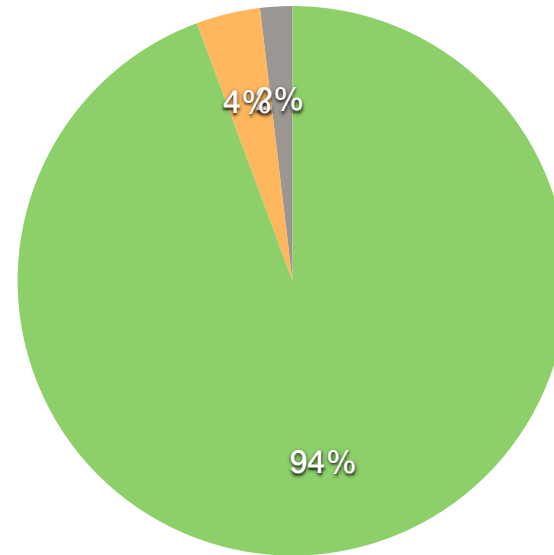
